**SUMMARY**

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure.

**A BILL FOR AN ACT**

2 Relating to state financial administration; creating new provisions; amending sections 1, 2 and 7,  
3 chapter 727, Oregon Laws 2009, and section 87, chapter 95, Oregon Laws 2010; appropriating  
4 money; limiting expenditures; and declaring an emergency.

5 **Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:**

6 **SECTION 1. (1) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the General Fund appropri-**  
7 **ation made to the Department of Education by section 1, chapter 635, Oregon Laws 2009, for**  
8 **the biennium beginning July 1, 2009, is increased by \$16,933,881 for the State School Fund.**

9 **(2) Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on expenditures**  
10 **established by section 2, chapter 635, Oregon Laws 2009, for the biennium beginning July 1,**  
11 **2009, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from lottery moneys allocated from the**  
12 **Administrative Services Economic Development Fund to the Department of Education, is**  
13 **increased by \$18,610,922 for the State School Fund.**

14 **SECTION 2. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on**  
15 **expenditures established by section 2 (6), chapter 657, Oregon Laws 2009, for the biennium**  
16 **beginning July 1, 2009, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from fees, moneys or**  
17 **other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, but excluding lottery funds and federal**  
18 **funds, collected or received by the Oregon Department of Administrative Services, is in-**  
19 **creased by \$8,000,000 for prepayment of debt service.**

20 **SECTION 3. (1) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the General Fund appropri-**  
21 **ation made to the Judicial Department by section 1 (1), chapter 723, Oregon Laws 2009, for**  
22 **the biennium beginning July 1, 2009, is decreased by \$12,426,997 for operations.**

1 (2) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the General Fund appropriation made to  
2 the Judicial Department by section 1 (2), chapter 723, Oregon Laws 2009, for the biennium  
3 beginning July 1, 2009, is decreased by \$500,000 for mandated payments.

4 (3) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the General Fund appropriation made to  
5 the Judicial Department by section 1 (3), chapter 723, Oregon Laws 2009, for the biennium  
6 beginning July 1, 2009, is decreased by \$436,717 for debt service.

7 **SECTION 4.** (1) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the General Fund appropri-  
8 ation made to the Public Defense Services Commission by section 1 (1), chapter 684, Oregon  
9 Laws 2009, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2009, is decreased by \$110,000 for the appellate  
10 division.

11 (2) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the General Fund appropriation made to  
12 the Public Defense Services Commission by section 1 (2), chapter 684, Oregon Laws 2009, for  
13 the biennium beginning July 1, 2009, is increased by \$905,000 for trial-level public defense.

14 **SECTION 5.** Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the General Fund appropriation  
15 made to the Commission on Judicial Fitness and Disability by section 1 (2), chapter 672,  
16 Oregon Laws 2009, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2009, is decreased by \$20,941 for ex-  
17 traordinary expenditures.

18 **SECTION 6.** (1) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the General Fund appropri-  
19 ation made to the Oregon Military Department by section 1 (4), chapter 734, Oregon Laws  
20 2009, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2009, is decreased by \$1,254,911 for capital debt ser-  
21 vice and related costs.

22 (2) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the General Fund appropriation made to  
23 the Oregon Military Department by section 1 (1), chapter 734, Oregon Laws 2009, for the  
24 biennium beginning July 1, 2009, is increased by \$62,517 for administration.

25 (3) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the General Fund appropriation made to  
26 the Oregon Military Department by section 1 (2), chapter 734, Oregon Laws 2009, for the  
27 biennium beginning July 1, 2009, is increased by \$220,163 for operations.

28 (4) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the General Fund appropriation made to  
29 the Oregon Military Department by section 1 (3), chapter 734, Oregon Laws 2009, for the  
30 biennium beginning July 1, 2009, is decreased by \$750,341 for community support.

31 **SECTION 7.** Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the General Fund appropriation  
32 made to the Employment Relations Board by section 1, chapter 666, Oregon Laws 2009, for  
33 the biennium beginning July 1, 2009, is increased by \$23,380 for restoration of administrative  
34 law judge and mediation services.

35 **SECTION 8.** (1) Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on  
36 expenditures established by section 49, chapter 95, Oregon Laws 2010, for the biennium be-  
37 ginning July 1, 2009, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from fees, moneys or  
38 other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, but excluding lottery funds and federal  
39 funds, collected or received by the Legislative Fiscal Officer from the Judicial System Sur-  
40 charge Account, is decreased by \$2,484 for contracting expenses of the Joint Interim Com-  
41 mittee on State Justice System Revenues created by section 39, chapter 659, Oregon Laws  
42 2009.

43 (2) Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on expenditures  
44 established by section 2, chapter 676, Oregon Laws 2009, as amended by section 28 (1), chap-  
45 ter 95, Oregon Laws 2010, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2009, as the maximum limit for

1 payment of expenses from fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts,  
2 but excluding lottery funds and federal funds, collected or received by the Legislative Ad-  
3 ministration Committee, is decreased by \$37,769 for expenses of the Joint Interim Committee  
4 on State Justice System Revenues created by section 39, chapter 659, Oregon Laws 2009.

5 **SECTION 9.** Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on  
6 expenditures established by section 2 (1), chapter 670, Oregon Laws 2009, for the biennium  
7 beginning July 1, 2009, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from fees, moneys or  
8 other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, but excluding lottery funds and federal  
9 funds, collected or received by the Oregon University System, is increased by \$17,398,584 for  
10 education and general services of higher education.

11 **SECTION 10.** (1) Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on  
12 expenditures established by section 47 (2), chapter 910, Oregon Laws 2009, for the fiscal year  
13 beginning July 1, 2009, and ending June 30, 2010, as the maximum limit for payment of ex-  
14 penses from federal funds collected or received by the Oregon University System, is in-  
15 creased by \$17,645,677.

16 (2) Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on expenditures  
17 established by section 47 (3), chapter 910, Oregon Laws 2009, for the fiscal year beginning  
18 July 1, 2010, and ending June 30, 2011, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from  
19 federal funds collected or received by the Oregon University System, is decreased by  
20 \$15,777,188.

21 **SECTION 11.** Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on  
22 expenditures established by section 1, chapter 154, Oregon Laws 2009, for the biennium be-  
23 ginning July 1, 2009, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from fees, moneys or  
24 other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, but excluding lottery funds and federal  
25 funds, collected or received by the Oregon Board of Licensed Professional Counselors and  
26 Therapists, is increased by \$136,750.

27 **SECTION 12.** Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on  
28 expenditures established by section 3 (3), chapter 729, Oregon Laws 2009, for the biennium  
29 beginning July 1, 2009, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses, other than expenses  
30 described in sections 6 and 10, chapter 729, Oregon Laws 2009, from fees, moneys or other  
31 revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, but excluding lottery funds and federal funds,  
32 collected or received by the Department of Education, is increased by \$1,033,857 for the  
33 Youth Corrections Education Program.

34 **SECTION 13.** Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the General Fund appropriation  
35 made to the Department of Justice by section 1 (1), chapter 728, Oregon Laws 2009, for the  
36 biennium beginning July 1, 2009, is increased by \$93,605 for paying expenses of district at-  
37 torneys and their deputies.

38 **SECTION 14.** Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the General Fund appropriation  
39 made to the Department of Justice by section 1, chapter 673, Oregon Laws 2009, for the  
40 biennium beginning July 1, 2009, is increased by \$343,066.

41 **SECTION 15.** (1) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the General Fund appro-  
42 priation made to the Department of Corrections by section 1 (1), chapter 860, Oregon Laws  
43 2009, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2009, is increased by \$20,899,977 for operations and  
44 health services.

45 (2) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the General Fund appropriation made to

1 the Department of Corrections by section 1 (2), chapter 860, Oregon Laws 2009, for the  
 2 biennium beginning July 1, 2009, is increased by \$779,665 for administration, public services,  
 3 general services and human resources.

4 (3) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the General Fund appropriation made to  
 5 the Department of Corrections by section 1 (3), chapter 860, Oregon Laws 2009, for the  
 6 biennium beginning July 1, 2009, is increased by \$1,409,978 for transitional services.

7 (4) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the General Fund appropriation made to  
 8 the Department of Corrections by section 1 (5), chapter 860, Oregon Laws 2009, for the  
 9 biennium beginning July 1, 2009, is decreased by \$1,112,635 for debt service.

10 **SECTION 16.** Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the General Fund appropriation  
 11 made to the Department of Human Services by section 1 (3), chapter 732, Oregon Laws 2009,  
 12 for the biennium beginning July 1, 2009, is increased by \$1,062,254 for community mental  
 13 health services for adults and children not eligible for Medicaid.

14 **SECTION 17.** Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the General Fund appropriation  
 15 made to the Department of Human Services by section 1 (4), chapter 732, Oregon Laws 2009,  
 16 for the biennium beginning July 1, 2009, is increased by the following amounts for the fol-  
 17 lowing purposes:

- 18 (1) \$294,749 for Medicaid in-home services.
- 19 (2) \$443,176 for case management for children with developmental disabilities.
- 20 (3) \$1,600,662 for Oregon Project Independence.
- 21 (4) \$334,552 for Medicaid targeted case management services for persons with develop-  
 22 mental disabilities.
- 23 (5) \$490,909 for the developmental disabilities family support program.

24 **SECTION 18.** Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the authorized appropriations  
 25 and expenditure limitations for the biennium beginning July 1, 2009, for the Secretary of  
 26 State are changed by the amounts specified:

3     **SECTION 19.** In addition to and not in lieu of any other appropriation, there is appro-  
4 priated to the Department of State Lands, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2009, out of the  
5 General Fund, the amount of \$2,025,939 for expenses related to expert witness fees for the  
6 Portland Harbor.

7     **SECTION 20.** Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the General Fund appropriation  
8 made to the State Forestry Department by section 1 (2), chapter 730, Oregon Laws 2009, for  
9 the biennium beginning July 1, 2009, is increased by \$3,657,675 for costs associated with con-  
10 tracting for large air tankers and helicopters to supplement fire suppression resources for  
11 the 2009 fire season and to pay the 2010 fire insurance premium.

12     **SECTION 21.** Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the General Fund appropriation  
13 made to the Oregon Youth Authority by section 1 (1), chapter 725, Oregon Laws 2009, for the  
14 biennium beginning July 1, 2009, is increased by \$3,160,000 for operations.

15     **SECTION 22.** (1) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the General Fund appro-  
16 priation made to the State Board of Parole and Post-Prison Supervision by section 1, chapter  
17 681, Oregon Laws 2009, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2009, is increased by \$85,000.

18     (2) Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on expenditures  
19 established by section 2, chapter 681, Oregon Laws 2009, for the biennium beginning July 1,  
20 2009, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from fees, moneys or other revenues,  
21 including Miscellaneous Receipts, but excluding lottery funds and federal funds, collected or  
22 received by the State Board of Parole and Post-Prison Supervision, is increased by \$11,000.

23     **SECTION 23.** In addition to and not in lieu of any other appropriation, there is appro-  
24 priated to the Department of Education, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2009, out of the  
25 General Fund, the amount of \$606,754 for transition costs and other services provided to  
26 blind and visually impaired students and for the closure and disposition of the Oregon School  
27 for the Blind.

28     **SECTION 24.** In addition to and not in lieu of any other appropriation, there is appro-  
29 priated to the Department of Human Services, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2009, out  
30 of the General Fund, the amount of \$268,944 for transition costs and other services provided  
31 to blind and visually impaired students.

32     **SECTION 25.** Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the General Fund appropriation  
33 made to the Department of Education by section 6, chapter 635, Oregon Laws 2009, for the  
34 biennium beginning July 1, 2009, for the Local Option Equalization Grants Account, is in-  
35 creased by \$817,663.

36     **SECTION 26.** Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the General Fund appropriation  
37 made to the Department of Education by section 2 (1), chapter 729, Oregon Laws 2009, for  
38 the biennium beginning July 1, 2009, is increased by \$1,007,740 for early intervention services  
39 and early childhood special education programs.

40     **SECTION 27.** Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the General Fund appropriation  
41 made to the Department of Education by section 2 (5), chapter 729, Oregon Laws 2009, for  
42 the biennium beginning July 1, 2009, is increased by \$996,532 for the Oregon prekindergarten  
43 program.

44     **SECTION 28.** Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on  
45 expenditures established by section 51 (4), chapter 910, Oregon Laws 2009, for the fiscal year

1 beginning July 1, 2010, and ending June 30, 2011, as the maximum limit for payment of ex-  
 2 penses from federal funds collected or received by the Department of Education for the State  
 3 School Fund, is decreased by \$1,868,489.

4 **SECTION 29.** Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the authorized appropriations  
 5 and expenditure limitations for the biennium beginning July 1, 2009, for the Legislative As-  
 6 sembly are changed by the amounts specified:

40 **Sec. 87.** (1) Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the amount of [~~\$2,694,971~~]  
 41 **\$2,285,775** is established for the biennium beginning July 1, 2009, as the maximum limit for payment  
 42 of expenses from fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, but excluding  
 43 lottery funds and federal funds, collected or received by the Oregon Department of Administrative  
 44 Services, for debt service on projects funded with certificates of participation sold under chapter 2,  
 45 Oregon Laws 2009.

**Sec. 2.** Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the following amounts are established for the biennium beginning July 1, 2009, as the maximum limits for payment of expenses from fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, but excluding lottery funds, federal funds and those funds described in section 6, **chapter 727, Oregon Laws 2009** [of this 2009 Act], collected or received by the Department of Community Colleges and Workforce Development, for the following purposes:

- (1) Department of Community  
Colleges and Workforce  
Development..... \$ 3,267,956
- (2) Oregon Youth Conservation  
Corps..... \$ 2,744,510
- [(3) Debt service..... \$ 2,764,688]

**SECTION 33.** Section 7, chapter 727, Oregon Laws 2009, is amended to read:

**Sec. 7.** Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the amount of [~~\$7,911,324~~] **\$7,588,256** is established for the biennium beginning July 1, 2009, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses by the Department of Community Colleges and Workforce Development from lottery moneys allocated from the Administrative Services Economic Development Fund to the department for debt service on lottery bonds.

**SECTION 34.** Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the amount of **\$323,068** is established for the biennium beginning July 1, 2009, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses by the Oregon Department of Administrative Services from lottery moneys allocated from the Administrative Services Economic Development Fund for debt service and related costs on certificates of participation for projects authorized under chapter 2, Oregon Laws 2009.

1        **SECTION 35.** This 2011 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public  
2        peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2011 Act takes effect  
3        on its passage.
