

HOUSE AMENDMENTS TO HOUSE BILL 2187

By COMMITTEE ON HIGHER EDUCATION AND WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT

1 On page 1 of the printed bill, line 2, after “schools;” delete the rest of the line and line 3 and
2 insert “amending ORS 345.015; and declaring an emergency.”.

3 Delete lines 5 through 30 and delete pages 2 through 4 and insert:

4 “**SECTION 1.** ORS 345.015 is amended to read:

5 “345.015. ORS 345.010 to 345.450 do not apply to:

6 “(1) Instruction or training solely avocational or recreational in nature or to institutions offer-
7 ing such education exclusively.

8 “(2) Instruction or training sponsored or offered by a bona fide trade, business, professional or
9 fraternal organization or by a business [*solely*] **primarily** for the organization’s membership or the
10 business’s employees.

11 “(3) Instruction or training sponsored, offered or contracted by organizations, institutions or
12 agencies, if the instruction or training is advertised or promoted to be in the nature of professional
13 self-improvement or personal self-improvement and the instruction or training is not:

14 “(a) Advertised or promoted as leading to or fulfilling the requirements for licensing, certifi-
15 cation, accreditation or education credentials; or

16 “(b) Leading to an occupation, employment or other activity for which a person may reasonably
17 expect financial compensation.

18 “(4) Courses offered in hospitals that meet standards prescribed by the American Medical As-
19 sociation or national accrediting associations for nursing.

20 “(5) Courses, instruction or training offered for a limited number of hours, as defined by rule
21 of the State Board of Education.

22 “(6) Schools offering only courses of an advanced training or continuing educational nature
23 when offered solely to licensed practitioners and people previously qualified or employed in the
24 profession for which a course is being offered.

25 “**(7) Courses, instruction or training offered to prepare a student to become certified as**
26 **a nursing assistant or a medication aide in compliance with standards prescribed by the**
27 **Oregon State Board of Nursing.**

28 “[~~(7)~~] **(8)** Schools that the Superintendent of Public Instruction:

29 “**(a)** Determines are adequately regulated by other means that guarantee the school meets the
30 standards [~~of~~] **described in ORS 345.325[.]; and**

31 “**(b) As a result of the determination described in paragraph (a) of this subsection, grants**
32 **an exemption from the licensure requirements of ORS 345.010 to 345.450.**

33 “[~~(8)~~] **(9)** Schools offering only review instruction to prepare a student to take an examination
34 to enter a profession, where the student has completed prior training related to the profession.

35 “[~~(9)~~] **(10)** Schools described in ORS 348.597 and, except as provided in ORS 345.017, schools

1 approved by the Higher Education Coordinating Commission to confer or offer to confer academic
2 degrees under ORS 348.606.

3 “[10] (11) Any parochial or denominational institution providing instruction or training relat-
4 ing solely to religion and that does not grant degrees.

5 “**SECTION 2.** ORS 345.015, as amended by section 21, chapter 104, Oregon Laws 2012, is
6 amended to read:

7 “345.015. ORS 345.010 to 345.450 do not apply to:

8 “(1) Instruction or training solely avocational or recreational in nature or to institutions offer-
9 ing such education exclusively.

10 “(2) Instruction or training sponsored or offered by a bona fide trade, business, professional or
11 fraternal organization or by a business [*solely*] **primarily** for the organization’s membership or the
12 business’s employees.

13 “(3) Instruction or training sponsored, offered or contracted by organizations, institutions or
14 agencies, if the instruction or training is advertised or promoted to be in the nature of professional
15 self-improvement or personal self-improvement and the instruction or training is not:

16 “(a) Advertised or promoted as leading to or fulfilling the requirements for licensing, certifi-
17 cation, accreditation or education credentials; or

18 “(b) Leading to an occupation, employment or other activity for which a person may reasonably
19 expect financial compensation.

20 “(4) Courses offered in hospitals that meet standards prescribed by the American Medical As-
21 sociation or national accrediting associations for nursing.

22 “(5) Courses, instruction or training offered for a limited number of hours, as defined by rule
23 of the Higher Education Coordinating Commission.

24 “(6) Schools offering only courses of an advanced training or continuing educational nature
25 when offered solely to licensed practitioners and people previously qualified or employed in the
26 profession for which a course is being offered.

27 “**(7) Courses, instruction or training offered to prepare a student to become certified as**

33 “**(b) As a result of the determination described in paragraph (a) of this subsection, grants**
34 **an exemption from the licensure requirements of ORS 345.010 to 345.450.**

35 “[8] (9) Schools offering only review instruction to prepare a student to take an examination
36 to enter a profession, where the student has completed prior training related to the profession.

37 “[9] (10) Schools described in ORS 348.597 and, except as provided in ORS 345.017, schools
38 approved by the Higher Education Coordinating Commission to confer or offer to confer academic
39 degrees under ORS 348.606.

40 “[10] (11) Any parochial or denominational institution providing instruction or training relat-
41 ing solely to religion and that does not grant degrees.

42 “**SECTION 3. This 2013 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public**
43 **peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2013 Act takes effect**
44 **July 1, 2013.”**
