Increases penalty for providing to licensed dealer or private seller false name or materially false information or identification in connection with purchase or transfer of firearm or ammunition, with intent to deceive dealer or seller about lawfulness of purchase or transfer. Increases penalties for certain crimes related to unlawful possession, purchase and transfer of firearms. Appropriates \$44 million in General Fund revenue to Oregon Health Authority for 2015-17 biennium to provide mental health services.

Senate Bill 941-MRB2 would increase penalties for several crimes related to the purchasing and transferring of firearms. It would increase the penalty for providing to licensed dealer or private seller a false name or materially false information or identification in connection with purchase or transfer of a firearm or ammunition, with the intent to deceive dealer or seller about lawfulness of purchase or transfer. This practice is commonly referred to as a “straw purchase.” The penalty for a straw purchase would be increased from a Class A misdemeanor to a Class C felony.

SB 941-MRB2 would increase the penalty for the unlawful purchase of a firearm from a Class A misdemeanor to a Class C felony; increase penalty for the unlawful transfer of firearm from a Class A misdemeanor to a Class C felony; increase penalty for unlawful possession of a firearm from a Class A misdemeanor to a Class C felony and would increase penalty for a felon in possession of a firearm from Class C felony to Class B felony.
