

# Senate Bill 705

Sponsored by Senator DEMBROW, Representative KENY-GUYER; Senator SHIELDS, Representatives FREDERICK, NOSSE, SMITH WARNER

## SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Directs Oregon Health Authority to study and report on demolition of residential structures that have been painted with lead-based paint or insulated with asbestos and risks to public health associated with such demolitions. Requires authority to submit report to interim committee of Legislative Assembly related to health no later than September 15, 2016.

Sunsets on date of convening of 2017 regular session of Legislative Assembly.

Declares emergency, effective on passage.

## A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to demolition of residential structures; and declaring an emergency.

3 **Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:**

4 **SECTION 1. (1) The Oregon Health Authority shall study and make a report on the**  
5 **demolition of residential structures that have been painted with lead-based paint, as that**  
6 **term is defined in ORS 431.918, or that have been insulated with asbestos. The authority shall**  
7 **study the risks to public health presented by the demolition of such structures, and strate-**  
8 **gies for mitigating those risks. The authority shall also study the relative risks presented**  
9 **by the demolition of such structures in areas with different population densities, including**  
10 **the relative risks presented in the demolition of such structures in cities with a population**  
11 **density of greater than 500 people per square mile.**

12 **(2) The authority shall submit the report described in subsection (1) of this section to**  
13 **an interim committee of the Legislative Assembly related to health no later than September**  
14 **15, 2016.**

15 **SECTION 2. Section 1 of this 2015 Act is repealed on the date of the convening of the 2017**  
16 **regular session of the Legislative Assembly as specified in ORS 171.010.**

17 **SECTION 3. This 2015 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public**  
18 **peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2015 Act takes effect**  
19 **on its passage.**
