

**PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO
HOUSE BILL 5017**

1 On page 1 of the printed bill, delete lines 4 through 26 and delete page 2
2 and insert:

3 **SECTION 1. In addition to and not in lieu of any other appropri-**
4 **ation, there is appropriated to the Department of Education, for the**
5 **biennium beginning July 1, 2015, out of the General Fund, the amount**
6 **of \$6,912,858,941 for the State School Fund.**

7 **SECTION 2. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures,**
8 **the amount of \$342,141,059 is established for the biennium beginning**
9 **July 1, 2015, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from lot-**
10 **tery moneys allocated from the Administrative Services Economic**
11 **Development Fund to the Department of Education for the State**
12 **School Fund.**

13 **SECTION 3. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures,**
14 **the amount of \$3,260,692 is established for the biennium beginning July**
15 **1, 2015, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses by the De-**
16 **partment of Education from fees, moneys or other revenues, including**
17 **Miscellaneous Receipts, but excluding lottery funds and federal funds,**
18 **collected or received by the Department of Education for the State**
19 **School Fund.**

20 **SECTION 4. Notwithstanding ORS 327.008 and 327.013, for the**
21 **biennium beginning July 1, 2015, the Department of Education:**

22 **“(1) May spend up to \$968,000 from the State School Fund for the**

1 contract described in ORS 329.488.

2 “(2) May spend up to \$1,600,000 from the State School Fund for
3 purposes related to the Oregon Virtual School District.

4 “(3) May spend up to \$12,500,000 from the State School Fund for an
5 English language learners program. Up to \$10,000,000 of this amount
6 may be used to support school districts that are identified as low-
7 performing districts relating to English language learners. Up to
8 \$2,500,000 of this amount may be used for technical assistance, best
9 practice support and implementation of the statewide English lan-
10 guage learners plan.

11 “(4) May spend up to \$2,395,593 from the State School Fund to pro-
12 vide lunches, at no charge to the student, to students who are eligible
13 for reduced price lunches under the United States Department of
14 Agriculture’s current Income Eligibility Guidelines.

15 “SECTION 5. (1) The Department of Education may not spend more
16 than \$3,629,130,346, plus one-half of any amount appropriated under
17 section 7 of this 2015 Act, from the State School Fund for the fiscal
18 year beginning July 1, 2015.

19 “(2) The Department of Education may not spend more than
20 \$3,629,130,346, plus one-half of any amount appropriated under section
21 7 of this 2015 Act, from the State School Fund for the fiscal year be-
22 ginning July 1, 2016.

23 “SECTION 6. The amount of \$2,859,866 is transferred from the State
24 School Fund to the Local Option Equalization Grants Account created
25 in ORS 327.339.

26 “SECTION 7. In addition to and not in lieu of any other appropri-
27 ation, there is appropriated to the Department of Education, for the
28 biennium beginning July 1, 2015, out of the General Fund, the amount
29 determined under section 8 of this 2015 Act, for the State School Fund.

30 “SECTION 8. (1) As part of the estimate of revenues prepared in

1 May 2015, the Oregon Department of Administrative Services shall
2 determine whether the total amount of General Fund revenues esti-
3 mated to be available for the biennium beginning July 1, 2015, is more
4 than the total amount of General Fund revenues estimated to be
5 available for the biennium beginning July 1, 2015, in the estimate of
6 revenues prepared by the department in February 2015.

7 “(2) If the condition specified in subsection (1) of this section is met,
8 the department shall determine the amount that is equal to the dif-
9 ference between the total amount of General Fund revenues estimated
10 to be available for the biennium beginning July 1, 2015, included in the
11 estimate of revenues prepared by the department in May 2015, and the
12 total amount of General Fund revenues that was estimated to be
13 available for the biennium beginning July 1, 2015, in the estimate of
14 revenues prepared by the department in February 2015.

15 “(3) The amount appropriated under section 7 of this 2015 Act is an
16 amount equal to 40 percent of the amount determined under sub-
17 section (2) of this section.

18 “(4) Section 7 of this 2015 Act is not operative unless the estimate
19 of revenues prepared by the Oregon Department of Administrative
20 Services in May 2015 shows that the total amount of General Fund
21 revenues estimated to be available for the biennium beginning July 1,
22 2015, is more than the total amount of General Fund revenues esti-
23 mated to be available for the biennium beginning July 1, 2015, in the
24 estimate of revenues prepared by the department in February 2015.

25 “SECTION 9. If the conditions in section 8 of this 2015 Act are met,
26 section 7 of this 2015 Act becomes operative July 1, 2015.

27 “SECTION 10. This 2015 Act being necessary for the immediate
28 preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is
29 declared to exist, and this 2015 Act takes effect July 1, 2015.”

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
