

# House Bill 5203

Sponsored by JOINT COMMITTEE ON WAYS AND MEANS

## SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Limits, for six-year period beginning July 1, 2015, payment of expenses from fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, but excluding lottery funds and federal funds, collected or received by Oregon Military Department for Oregon Military Museum.

Limits, for six-year period beginning July 1, 2015, payment of expenses from fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts and federal funds, but excluding lottery funds, collected or received by Oregon Military Department for Sharff Hall/Maison Armory.

Increases limitation on expenditures from fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts and federal funds, but excluding lottery funds, collected or received by Oregon Military Department for Oregon Military Museum.

Increases limitation on expenditures from federal funds collected or received by Oregon Military Department for Medford Armory.

Declares emergency, effective on passage.

## A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to state financial administration; and declaring an emergency.

3 **Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:**

4 **SECTION 1. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the amount of \$725,963**  
5 **is established for a six-year period beginning July 1, 2015, as the maximum limit for payment**  
6 **of expenses from fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, but ex-**  
7 **cluding lottery funds and federal funds, collected or received by the Oregon Military De-**  
8 **partment, for the acquisition of land and the acquisition, planning, constructing, altering,**  
9 **repairing, furnishing and equipping of the Oregon Military Museum.**

10 **SECTION 2. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the amount of**  
11 **\$2,051,033 is established for a six-year period beginning July 1, 2015, as the maximum limit**  
12 **for payment of expenses from fees, moneys, or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Re-**  
13 **ceipts and federal funds, but excluding lottery funds, collected or received by the Oregon**  
14 **Military Department, for the acquisition of land and the acquisition, planning, constructing,**  
15 **altering, repairing, furnishing and equipping of the Sharff Hall/Maison Armory.**

16 **SECTION 3. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on**  
17 **expenditures established by section 2 (1)(c), chapter 808, Oregon Laws 2015, for a six-year**  
18 **period beginning July 1, 2015, as the maximum limit for the expenditure of federal funds**  
19 **collected or received by the Oregon Military Department for the acquisition of land and the**  
20 **acquisition, planning, constructing, altering, repairing, furnishing and equipping of the**  
21 **Medford Armory is increased by \$940,800.**

22 **SECTION 4. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on**  
23 **expenditures established by section 7, chapter 808, Oregon Laws 2015, for a six-year period**  
24 **beginning July 1, 2013, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from fees, moneys or**  
25 **other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts and federal funds, but excluding lottery**

**NOTE:** Matter in **boldfaced** type in an amended section is new; matter *[italic and bracketed]* is existing law to be omitted. New sections are in **boldfaced** type.

1 funds, collected or received by the Oregon Military Department for the acquisition of land  
2 and the acquisition, planning, constructing, altering, repairing, furnishing and equipping of  
3 the Oregon Military Museum is increased by \$622,748.

4 SECTION 5. This 2016 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public  
5 peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2016 Act takes effect  
6 on its passage.
