I am writing to urge you to vote "yes" on the HB 2027 amendment.

While I am a bit proponent of outdoor recreation and am a huge outdoor recreationalist and trail user myself, I have seen first-hand the negative impact from "on trail and off trail" activities in terms of the pressure on wildlife in and around Bend. We are fortunate to have hundreds of miles of trails within reach here in Bend, but some public agencies like Bend Parks & Recreation continue to push for more convenience and access. This has had a real and noticeable affect on wildlife who used to have free range of these protected areas. I am writing to ask all of you to please take a stand by protecting the Upper Deschutes Scenic Waterway from further human encroachment. I live very near this protected space and we have Osprey nests, bald Eagles, Bobcats, deer, wildlife too numerous to count. When does the encroachment stop? When is enough, enough?
