

**A-Engrossed
House Bill 2114**

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure.

[Prohibits issuing initial prescription for opioids or opiates to adults for outpatient use in quantity exceeding seven-day supply.]

[Prohibits issuing initial and refill prescription for opioids or opiates to minors for outpatient use in quantity exceeding seven-day supply.]

[Creates exceptions.]

Directs Oregon Medical Board, Oregon State Board of Nursing and Oregon Board of Dentistry to provide licensees of boards with opioid and opiate prescribing guidelines and recommendations established by association of licensee practitioners.

Takes effect 91st day after adjournment sine die.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

Relating to prescription drugs; and prescribing an effective date.

Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

SECTION 1. Not later than January 1, 2018, the Oregon Medical Board, the Oregon State Board of Nursing and the Oregon Board of Dentistry shall provide notice to the practitioners regulated by each board who are authorized under the laws of this state to prescribe opioids or opiates of the Oregon Opioid Prescribing Guidelines: Recommendations for the Safe Use of Opioid Medications, as endorsed by the Oregon Medical Board in January 2017.

SECTION 2. As soon as practicable after the establishment of guidelines or recommendations as described in this section, the Oregon Medical Board, the Oregon State Board of Nursing and the Oregon Board of Dentistry shall provide notice to the practitioners regulated by each board who are authorized under the laws of this state to prescribe opioids or opiates of any guidelines or recommendations established by any association of practitioners whose members are regulated by the boards.

SECTION 3. This 2017 Act takes effect on the 91st day after the date on which the 2017 regular session of the Seventy-ninth Legislative Assembly adjourns sine die.
