

HOUSE AMENDMENTS TO A-ENGROSSED HOUSE BILL 3078

By JOINT COMMITTEE ON WAYS AND MEANS

1 On page 1 of the printed A-engrossed bill, line 6, delete “11” and insert “10”.

2 Delete pages 9 and 10 and insert:

“APPROPRIATIONS

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6 “SECTION 7. In addition to and not in lieu of any other appropriation, there is appro-
7 priated to the Oregon Criminal Justice Commission, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2017,
8 out of the General Fund, the amount of \$7,000,000, to be deposited in the Justice Reinvest-
9 ment Account described in section 52, chapter 649, Oregon Laws 2013, and expended for the
10 purposes of carrying out the provisions of section 9 of this 2017 Act.

11 “SECTION 8. In addition to and not in lieu of any other appropriation, there is appro-
12 priated to the Department of Justice, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2017, out of the
13 General Fund, the amount of \$1,000,000, for the Crime Victims’ Services Division and services
14 for victims of domestic and sexual violence.

“OREGON CRIMINAL JUSTICE COMMISSION

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18 “SECTION 9. (1) The Oregon Criminal Justice Commission shall establish a program to
19 award supplemental grant funds to counties for downward departure prison diversion pro-
20 grams as part of the Justice Reinvestment Program described in section 53, chapter 649,
21 Oregon Laws 2013. Notwithstanding sections 52 and 53 (1)(a), chapter 649, Oregon Laws 2013,
22 the commission shall use the moneys described in section 7 of this 2017 Act for supplemental
23 grant funds for downward departure prison diversion programs in counties selected by the
24 commission to receive the supplemental grant funds. The commission shall give preference
25 to counties establishing downward departure prison diversion programs on or after the ef-
26 fective date of this 2017 Act.

27 “(2) The commission shall monitor the downward departure prison diversion programs
28 described in subsection (1) of this section and evaluate prison utilization by counties that
29 receive the supplemental grant funds. The commission shall annually report the evaluation
30 findings to the Joint Interim Committee on Ways and Means.

31 “SECTION 10. The Oregon Criminal Justice Commission shall study the impact of this
32 2017 Act on prison utilization, recidivism and public safety and report the results of the study
33 to the interim committees of the Legislative Assembly related to the judiciary, in the manner
34 provided in ORS 192.245, no later than February 1 of each year.

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3 **“MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS**

4 **“SECTION 11. The unit captions used in this 2017 Act are provided only for the conven-**
5 **ience of the reader and do not become part of the statutory law of this state or express any**
6 **legislative intent in the enactment of this 2017 Act.**

7 **“SECTION 12. (1) The amendments to ORS 137.717 and 421.168 by sections 4 and 5 of this**
8 **2017 Act and the repeal of section 16, chapter 649, Oregon Laws 2013, by section 3 of this 2017**
9 **Act become operative on January 1, 2018.**

10 **“(2) The amendments to ORS 137.717 by section 6 of this 2017 Act become operative on**
11 **July 1, 2023.**

12 **“SECTION 13. (1) The amendments to section 1, chapter 830, Oregon Laws 2015, by sec-**
13 **tion 2 of this 2017 Act apply to sentences imposed on or after the effective date of this 2017**
14 **Act.**

15 **“(2) The amendments to ORS 137.717 and 421.168 by sections 4 and 5 of this 2017 Act apply**
16 **to sentences imposed on or after January 1, 2018.**

17 **“(3) The amendments to ORS 137.717 by section 6 of this 2017 Act apply to sentences**
18 **imposed on or after July 1, 2023.**

19 **“SECTION 14. (1) Section 9 of this 2017 Act is repealed on July 1, 2023.**

20 **“(2) Section 10 of this 2017 Act is repealed on January 2, 2028.**

21 **“EMERGENCY CLAUSE**

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23 **“SECTION 15. This 2017 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public**
24 **peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2017 Act takes effect**
25 **on its passage.”.**
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
