

Senate Bill 207

Printed pursuant to Senate Interim Rule 213.28 by order of the President of the Senate in conformance with pre-session filing rules, indicating neither advocacy nor opposition on the part of the President (at the request of Senate Interim Committee on Education)

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Requires each public university and community college to provide credit to students who receive certain grades on advanced placement examinations.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to receiving credit for advanced placement performance.

3 **Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:**

4 **SECTION 1. (1) As used in this section:**

5 (a) **“Advanced placement program” means a nationwide program that offers college-level**
6 **curricula and examinations to high school students, such as the advanced placement (AP)**
7 **program.**

8 (b) **“Community college” has the meaning given that term in ORS 341.005.**

9 (c) **“Successful grade on the examination” means the grade received by a student who:**

10 (A) **Participated in the nationwide examination offered at the conclusion of an advanced**
11 **placement program; and**

12 (B) **Received a grade on the nationwide examination indicating that the student is fully**
13 **qualified to receive college credit for the program, such as a grade of three or higher on an**
14 **advanced placement (AP) examination.**

15 (2) **Each public university listed in ORS 352.002 and each community college shall give**
16 **credit for each instance in which a student enrolled at the public university or community**
17 **college has:**

18 (a) **Participated in an advanced placement program; and**

19 (b) **Received a successful grade on the examination.**

20 **SECTION 2. Section 1 of this 2017 Act first applies to the 2018-2019 academic year.**
