

HOUSE AMENDMENTS TO HOUSE BILL 4063

1 On page 1 of the printed bill, line 2, after the first semicolon delete the rest of the line and
2 delete line 3 and insert “and declaring an emergency.”.

3 Delete lines 5 through 29 and delete pages 2 and 3 and insert:

4 **“SECTION 1. The Department of Transportation is the lead agency responsible for coor-**
5 **dination of autonomous vehicle programs and policies.**

6 **“SECTION 2. (1) The Task Force on Autonomous Vehicles is established.**

7 **“(2) The task force consists of 26 members appointed as follows:**

8 **“(a) The President of the Senate shall appoint two members from among members of the**
9 **Senate who are not members of the same party.**

10 **“(b) The Speaker of the House of Representatives shall appoint two members from among**
11 **members of the House of Representatives who are not members of the same party.**

12 **“(c) The Director of Transportation shall appoint 22 members as follows:**

13 **“(A) Six members representing state agencies that will be affected by the deployment of**
14 **autonomous vehicles.**

15 **“(B) Sixteen members from among the following:**

16 **“(i) The automotive industry;**

17 **“(ii) The cybersecurity industry;**

18 **“(iii) Law enforcement;**

19 **“(iv) Transportation network companies;**

20 **“(v) The autonomous vehicle technology industry;**

21 **“(vi) The automotive insurance industry;**

22 **“(vii) Trial lawyers;**

23 **“(viii) Workers’ unions;**

24 **“(ix) Transportation unions;**

25 **“(x) The Association of Oregon Counties;**

26 **“(xi) League of Oregon Cities;**

27 **“(xii) The American Automobile Association;**

28 **“(xiii) The Oregon Trucking Associations;**

29 **“(xiv) The taxicab industry;**

30 **“(xv) A metropolitan planning organization; and**

31 **“(xvi) The Oregon Transit Association.**

32 **“(3)(a) The task force shall develop recommendations for legislation to be introduced**
33 **during the next odd-numbered year regular session of the Legislative Assembly regarding the**
34 **deployment of autonomous vehicles on highways.**

35 **“(b) The proposed legislation under this section shall be consistent with federal law and**

1 **guidelines and shall address the following issues:**

2 **“(A) Licensing and registration;**

3 **“(B) Law enforcement and accident reporting;**

4 **“(C) Cybersecurity; and**

5 **“(D) Insurance and liability.**

6 **“(4) The task force may study and consider the potential long-term effects of autonomous**
7 **vehicle deployment to be addressed in future legislation, including the following:**

8 **“(a) Land use;**

9 **“(b) Road and infrastructure design;**

10 **“(c) Public transit;**

11 **“(d) Workforce changes; or**

12 **“(e) State responsibilities relating to cybersecurity and privacy.**

13 **“(5) A majority of the voting members of the task force constitutes a quorum for the**
14 **transaction of business.**

15 **“(6) Official action by the task force requires the approval of a majority of the voting**
16 **members of the task force.**

17 **“(7) The task force shall elect one of its members to serve as chairperson.**

18 **“(8) If there is a vacancy for any cause, the appointing authority shall make an appoint-**
19 **ment to become immediately effective.**

20 **“(9) The task force shall meet at times and places specified by the call of the chairperson**
21 **or of a majority of the voting members of the task force.**

22 **“(10) The task force may adopt rules necessary for the operation of the task force.**

23 **“(11)(a) The task force shall submit a report in the manner provided by ORS 192.245, and**
24 **shall include recommendations for legislation described in subsection (3) of this section, to**
25 **the appropriate interim committee of the Legislative Assembly related to transportation no**
26 **later than September 15, 2018.**

27 **“(b) The task force may submit a report in the manner provided by ORS 192.245, and may**
28 **include recommendations for legislation, if any, resulting from the task force’s study under**
29 **subsection (4) of this section, to the appropriate interim committee of the Legislative As-**
30 **sembly related to transportation no later than September 15, 2019.**

31 **“(12) The Department of Transportation shall provide staff support to the task force.**

32 **“(13) Members of the Legislative Assembly appointed to the task force are nonvoting**
33 **members of the task force and may act in an advisory capacity only.**

34 **“(14) Members of the task force who are not members of the Legislative Assembly are**
35 **not entitled to compensation or reimbursement for expenses and serve as volunteers on the**
36 **task force.**

37 **“(15) All agencies of state government, as defined in ORS 174.111, are directed to assist**
38 **the task force in the performance of the task force’s duties and, to the extent permitted by**
39 **laws relating to confidentiality, to furnish information and advice the members of the task**
40 **force consider necessary to perform their duties.**

41 **“SECTION 3. Section 2 of this 2018 Act is repealed on January 2, 2021.**

42 **“SECTION 4. This 2018 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public**
43 **peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2018 Act takes effect**
44 **on its passage.”.**
