Public Hearing

- SB 17
Establishes Task Force on the Implementation of Electronic Transcripts in High School.
- SB 160
Requires public institutions of higher education to provide credit to each student who receives grade of four or higher on International Baccalaureate (IB) exam.
- SB 497
Lowers high school grade point average required to participate in Oregon Promise program from 2.5 to 2.0.
- SB 730
Integrates foundational curricula and unified statewide transfer agreements into Transfer Student Bill of Rights and Responsibilities.

Work Session

- SB 52
Requires school district to adopt policy on student suicide prevention.
- SB 180 **
Directs Department of Education to award grants to school districts to support safe schools by funding programs related to bullying prevention and youth empowerment. **Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means
- SB 485
Directs Oregon Health Authority to collaborate with certain schools and facilities when developing plan for communication following suspected suicide.
- SB 489 **
Encourages school districts to collaborate and enter into agreements with law enforcement and providers of social media websites and applications for purpose of responding to acts of cyberbullying. **Subsequent Referral(s) to Judiciary
