I am a concerned mother from Linn county and I'm writing to say that I strongly oppose HB3063.

I am the mother of one child who is fully vaccinated with all of the recommended vaccines except for one. My child has also been vaccinated for MMR (measles.)

When my child was still an infant, I began researching vaccines because I wanted to do what was best as a parent and also because I find medicine and medical advances fascinating. Vaccines have saved many lives and our world is a better place because of the use of vaccines.

Another reason I began researching vaccines is because my child and I have a gene mutation that causes our bodies to not be able to detox as well as the average person. I take precautions with our diet and environmental toxins because of this gene mutation. I also chose to take precautions with vaccines by opting for a slower vaccine schedule for my child. I remember at the time, I was so thankful that we lived in Oregon, where a slower schedule was permitted.

Everyone has their own circumstances and reasons why they choose to vaccinate, not vaccinate or delay vaccines for their child. HB3063 does not give adequate flexibility for the many different circumstances that exist.
