

To the HHC Committee:

I have taken my time to submit this email, because there is so much to say, it's almost overwhelming. I could send you hundreds--no, thousands--of pages of scientific data, doctor's statements, peer-reviewed/published medical studies, and anecdotal reports that detail why a bill like this is extremely dangerous for the health of Oregonian children. I have been researching this ever since my son's vaccine injury 6 years ago. And lest you think I don't know how to research because I am "just a mom," I will inform you that I held a 4.0 GPA all the way through school, attended the University of Oregon Honors College, graduated with honors, and wrote/defended a 140-page thesis as part of that education. I most certainly do know how to research, and it takes work, and time.

But in the interest of time, and the appropriate amount of brevity so as to be heard, I will distill my comments to these crucial points:

- This bill violates everything that Oregonians—who pride ourselves in our independent spirit and individual freedoms—stand for.
- It violates the constitution of the United States of America, the First Amendment of which holds that personal freedom of religion and freedom of conscience are of utmost importance and value--both of which are completely violated in this bill.
- It violates the principle of informed consent. You cannot force a medical procedure against a person's will. Did we learn nothing in the Nuremberg Trials?
- It violates the right of access to education for tens of thousands of children with personal belief or religious exemptions.
- Don't forget the fact that the vaccine industry is *completely* immune from liability when its products cause injuries and death. This gives them even less motivation to make a safe product than they had before, and it is honestly unconscionable to require children to inject such a product into their bodies.
- Where there is risk (and there is MASSIVE risk. I DARE you to read the inserts for the vaccines you are considering enforcing), there must be choice. Parents are usually unaware of their children's disposition to vaccine injury prior to injury occurring. Which again points back to the issue of informed consent. Doctors are failing to tell them!
